SITOUM has, it is believed, been appointed Tieserey of TIGHE, but there is no certain news of his havingbeen permitted to leave DESTIR yet to assume charge of his Previses.

It is not known whether the marriage arranged between Ras HALLU and Magna MIRHAIL's daughter (see heat Report) took place or not, may is there only further confirmation here of the statement that his has in to receive the kingdom of his father THELA HAIMANOT (see last Report).

The exact limits of Megus MIRRALL's kingdom are not yet known. He to credited with the desire to include within it BASSYMPDE, which now belongs to Ras WALDA GIORGISAND is the home of the boot fighters in ANYSETHIA.

Ascerding to the latest reports from Mr. ARUPBUSTER, (June 16th.) this remote, with the addition to it that MIRRAIL will also be given DEMPRE, has reached SUNDAR, where it is not unwelcome, the local Ambaras being theroughly tired of Ras WALDA GIUNGES and of Shown and "Galla" rule.

Mr. ARBERUSTER considers that in the event of a conflict between Ras WALDA GIORGIS and the adherente of Negus HITHAIL, the Ras could place no reliance on the local Ambara troops.

The Ras is now at DANKAZ, where his troops are still suffering from the effects on epidemic in Sorts of contagious dynastery) which attacked them in TISRS and which was groupousible there for the deaths of ever 2000 men. The Ras is said also to have lest some 3000 mules during that expedition.

Mr. ARCHRUSTER reports that as date as June 18th. it was remoured in dommar that the Rae was going to pasself. Sothing has transpired in AUES ARAPA or this, and the Rae has certainly not lest DARPAR yet - and is unlikely now to make any move until the rains are even

LIJ MYASSU who sas reported in good health in last Report, is unfortunately til again, and has been laid up for the last ten days.

External Affairs. The tension with ITALY continues.

Full configuration of the deings of the Italians at months and of their sotivities on the frontier near that place (vide last Report) does not been appear to have resched the Central Suverment. They have heard enough however to sause them to disbelieve Count COLLI's denials of the truth of the reports.

Mennwhile orders have been sent to Ras WALDA GIORGIS to send messengers to WGGARA to ask to be shown the bridge piers constructed by the Italians in the bed of the R. SETIT, and, if these are found to be here as reported, to arrest Sheikh IMAN of NOGARA and to send him to ADIS ARASA.

The telegraph extension from ADIS ABABA via DANKAZ (GONDAR) to GALLABAT referred to in last Report has been decided upon, and an arrangement concluded with the SUDAY Severment for the purchase of the necessary material for the CALLABAT-GONDAR section of the line, this material to be delivered at CALLABAT by the first week in August. The existing telephone line from ADIS APABA to DANKAZ will be adapted for telegraphy. The erection of this like will give the abyseminian Severment telegraphic with the North and the outside world independent of Italian central.

The relations between has WALDA GLORGIS and the Italians are not known. Mitherte he has been considered as violantly anti-European, and as recently as the recent troubles in TICRE he was believed to be creating difficulties with the Italian berder efficials. At the moment however be has his back against the wall and might be inclined to turn envehers for applicance The fact therefore that he has the Italian dector Tenente Bevilacqua in constant attendence on him at the present time may have some cimulicance. This sentleman, who speaks Asharie, was fermerly in charge of the Italian dispensery at GOEDAR, whence he was transferred to ADUA. Afters the hostilities in Tiers he was lent by the Italians to look after the wounded and subsequently remained with WALDA GIORGIS army. and second anion the Ras on his return to DARKAY. As least it carries be said that has WALDA GIOROIS has shown any great alderity to expose the Italian active 1 1es near WOGARA.

The Abyssinian Government still express themselv-COLLI as to the matter of the gift by har-6 manni Dejammach GABRA SILASER. (see last Report).

GARA SILARSE is still at large. With the consent of the Central Government, Count COLLI affered his personal mediation to this chief, on the condition that he would come and currender himself in ADES MANA. GARRA SILARSE however had not apparently any confidence in Sount COLLI's precent influence at the smaltal and declined the offer.

INTE ABARA.

Continuous and heavy has fallen in ADIS ABABA and the surrounding country in the last fifteen days.

It is hoped that the rain will put a stop (by remeving the caused - foul water) to a serious epidemic of a ferm of contagious dysentery which break out at the beginning of June in the districts on the edge of the plateau to the N.K., S.K. and East of ADIS ABABA. The mortality is said to have been very great, especially in and round ANKOEER.

Mr. J. Q. WOOD, Consul-General of the UNITED STATES, left ADIS ABABA for AMERICA on sick leave on June 28th. The new Commercial Treaty between the UNITED STATES and ARYSSINIA was signed the day before his departure. The new Treaty except for a minor alteration is the same as the old one - a simple "most " favoured nation" Treaty. It is to run for four years only, the Abyssinians having refused to meet the wishes of the U. S. Government, who hoped to obtain a ten years' Treaty. The point in their refusal is that the French Treaty, 19800 60 (the Franco-Abyssinian Treaty of 1908), on which the present foreign jurisdiction rights in ABYBSIBIA are based, expires in four years time, and the Abyssinian Government wish to have their hands free at that time to alter existing arrangements, and were alarmed - unnecessarily it would seem - by the clause in the new Tr aty giving "most favoured nation" jumisdiction rights.
