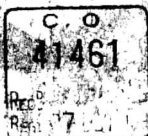

Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 20th instant,
B.
No. 39621/1914, enclosing a copy of a letter from Mr. C. A.
Blanke, an United States citizen, submitting a claim for
compensation for loss incurred owing to the occupation
by Indian troops of his premises in the East Africa
Protectorate known as the "Teavo Tannery", I am directed
by Secretary Sir E. Grey to request that you will inform
the Secretary of State for the Colonies that he concurs
in the reply which Mr. Harcourt proposes to return to
Mr. Blanke.

I am, however, to suggest that an addition should
be made to the proposed reply stating that in the mean-
while enquiries are being made in the matter, and that,
if Mr. Harcourt concurs, measures may be taken to
ascertain the amount of damage done to Mr. Blanke's
property.
