

THE QUARTER ASTER GENERAL IN INDIA.

I am directed to say that, with the approval of the Lost Hon'ble the Secretary of State for India, the Government of India sanction the despatch of the following officers, men and animals for service in connection with military operations in the British East Africa Protectorate:-

- (a) Three afficers of the Supply and Transport Corps for supply duties;
- (b) Three troops of camels with attendants.
- (c) One officer of the Native Indian Land Forces in command of the party of camels, and one Indian officer us sub-divisional commander.
  - (d) One sub-assistant surgeon, withone hospital cook.

- 2. Equipment on the authorised scales should be taken with the addition of the following articles specially asked for: 50 camel water tanks, 100 cavalry chaguls, 2 lift and force pumps, and 30 norse watering troughs.
- 3. The troops and followers will receive field service concessions and privileges from the date of embarkation, but such concessions as are admissible only from or setween certain dates fixed by regulations will have effect from phose dates. The "port of embarkation" will be considered the "pase" in the case of such concessions as are admissible at or beyond the base. field service clathing on summer scale only will be issued, boots, armunition country, or compensation for boots oning allowed in lieu of shoes, country.
- 4. Compensation will be paid for casualties among camels at Ps.120/- per camel for casualties cansed by
  exceptional circumstances and at Rs.60 per camel for
  casualties arising from ordinary causes.

5. All expenditure in connection with the despatch of the above details will be debitable to His Lajesty's Colonial Government, and I am to request that all vouchers, railway warrants, tolegrams, etc.
