ay 1914 regarding leave, I beg to inform you that

my leave to England has been sanctioned and that I

am proceeding direct to England Via Lenoa by Italian

boat and not going to Mombasa at all.

As there has been no chance of receiving a reply to the above mentioned letter I have taken an advance of pay here of Rs.382/- (three hundred and eighty two only) this I believe being the amount of a first class passage from hismayu to Bombay, Viamombasa. If this amount is given to me in lieu of my passage to India, as I presume it will be, you can recover the amount of my advance from it, if not the advance

advance can be recovered from my pay in communication with the India Office, if you have already sent my last pay certificate there.

I presume my pay for May 1914 Rs.543/12 has been paid into the National Bank of India, Mombasa, but have received no notification yet, as there has been no mail this month.

With reference to my letter to .B/23 dated 26th
May 1914 will you kindly pay the balance of my pay for
March and April (Viz 58/47) into the National Bank,
Lombasa, if this has not already been done.

"ith reference to your Y.1354 dated

26th September 1914, I beg to inform you that the amount I drew in respect of massage was .s.380 or is. 382 (I am not sure which as have not my file with me) and not is.480.

This amount had to be shown in my local cash account as an advance of pay, although I wrote a letter to the Paymaster 3rd K.A.R. Mairobi explaining why it was drawn. I can only think, that in spite of this letter it has been confused with an ordinary advance of pay and been deducted from my pay as you mugest, although the amount I drew for passage was not the exact

exact amount due to me as 20 days pay etc. The last pay I received was that for the month of Way.

I can think of no other explanation of the discrepancy as the 20 days pay for "une has not been received by me, nor can it have been accepted by my bank (the Mational Bank of India - ombasa Franch) as I closed my account with them before leaving must Africa and have since received from them the exact amount of the balance which I had in the bank at the time I left without including any pay for "une. That is to say there was no discrepancy in my favour which would account for the receipt by them of 20 days pay for June.
