I have the honour to inform you that subject to your approval I have sanctioned the payment of two claims for Rs. 17.50 and Rs. 15/- preferred by Dr. W. H. Heard on account of medical attendance to two officials who contracted illness whilst travelling on the Uasin Gishu Plateau where there is, at present, no Government Medical Officer.

2. In his despatch No. 713 of the 27th November 1909 Lord Crewe approved, as a temporary measure, of private medical practitioners being called in to attend Government officers in the stations of Dagoretti and Kyambu, and I would now ask that this be extended so as to include all stations where officials are unable to obtain
