Sir,

Since the adoption of the New Leave Regulations it has been found in many cases almost impossible to calculate correctly either the commencement or the termination of an officer's leave in England, and this difficulty is enhanced when an officer is granted additional leave without pay.

2. I therefore have the honour to ask whether it would be possible to instruct the Crown Agents to transmit a notification of the dates on which an officer's leave in England actually commences or expires, and also the name of the steamer by which he proposes to return. As this arrangement would obviate much unnecessary correspondence and would be more satisfactory as a whole I trust that you will be able to accede to my request.
