NEW VESSELS FOR LAKE VICTORIA

As it is impossible to provide £20,000 under ordinary expenditure trusts may be met out of balances. With regard to balance of £13,000 this also cannot be provided for under ordinary expenditure but will make proposals when submitting estimates which trusts will be satisfactory.

... conditions on which an expenditure of £33,000

were clearly explained by the inventor in our telegrams
