Sir,

With reference to the last paragraph of your despatch no. 262 of the 19th of May, I have the honour to submit a report on the operations of Sime Limited in this Protectorate.

2. The Company acquired five farms extending over 25,000 acres and have also purchased a farm of 5,000 acres which was formerly the property of Mr. J. M. Squire. This latter farm is maintained exclusively as a shooting box which is let to sportsmen, and when not occupied is in charge of a competent native headman. The development was valued in June last at £720.

3. Of the remaining 25,000 acres, two farms totalling 18,000 acres may be said to be practically unoccupied, as they are only utilized occasionally as grazing for the working Bullocks and as an adjunct to the shooting box. On the other three farms, however, there is permanent development of the beef herd, the value of which is estimated at nearly £2,500. The total value, therefore, of the development over the whole area in the possession of Sime Limited is rather over £8,000. Moreover, on the estate and not included in the above valuation are live stock worth

at least £1,500, and various turn improvements of a present value of £2,500. Three of the partners in the concern are in continuous operation, and in addition three white men are employed.

5. The estate is run on sound commercial lines, with a highly efficient Auditor as Secretary who monitors very closely the expenditure. As a result it is proved that with a capital expenditure equivalent to 1 million of R.R. the Company can only cover the costs totalling 18,000 acres, and will be unable to extend their operations for 50 years to come.
