Telegram. The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.  
(Received, Colonial office, 3.50 p.m. 25th November, 1911.)

Much regret met following telegram dated November 6th delayed in error. Your telegram 3rd November, \* I recognize that full responsibility rests on my shoulders. There are no Masai upon European farms except East Africa Syndicate - at request of manager at Masai. During the move the settlers gave every assistance and in most cases welcomed presence of the Masai as it improved grazing, though naturally in order to avoid future difficulties as soon as move was interrupted those who had not gone South were at once removed to their former territory. Your detailed orders have been noted for compliance. In no case can any further move take place before next May which allows ample time to satisfy you fully on the conditions you have laid down. By telegram 31st October details by despatch by next mail. Land in question lies to the West of Anra River and extends from Bakire to Chepalunga Forest and is uninhabited vide provisional map.

Dear Mr Macdonald,

I have now proof which satisfies me that my suspicions since the Maori were induced to agree to the move were correct. They were sent for and asked to sign a petition already drawn up purporting to be a voluntary request to go to the Southern Reserve. They were pressed to sign on several occasions until they finally submitted and agreed. There is no use asking if that was how it was done. The Government will not tolerate such practices.

Notice in the home papers a telegram from the Governor here last week how Cole had been induced to promise to leave the country under heavy escort. Carter's agent is the Mr. J.E. Wilson of the Legislation Council with whom Cole stayed when passing through Hobbs to the steamer. Ten days later the Governor put up with him when in Hobbs and only last week, Mr. Read, specially sent out by the C.O. to report on various questions, was by the Governor's instructions conveyed to Mr. Wilson's house enquiring from the steamer. These several things will be sent to you and will explain the kind of support the local government gives to the views of the C.O. that such official visitors should be entertained by the Provincial Commissioner. This will explain to you the kind of
