with reference to passage
 to East Africa by Union Castle
 steamer via Suez, we are in-
 formed by the Co that the steamer
 of the 10th Nov from Marseilles is
 full so far as 1st class passengers
 are concerned & they suggest as
 an alternative we should send
 our passengers to E. Africa by the
 "Balmuccia" Castle from Southampton
 on 28 Oct, proceeding via Cape
 & arriving Mombasa 4 Dec. leaving
 at 3 3/4 rate.
 You will see this means that
 officials would have to leave
 London ^{about} a fortnight earlier than
 is necessary & arrive in Mombasa
 a week later than steamer of 10 Nov.
 There are several alternative routes
 P & O & B. I. combined service from London
 transshipping at Aden, 10 Nov ->
 D. & A. from Marseilles 14 Nov
 Messageries Maritimes 10 Nov
 from Marseilles

For my 1st class passages that
 my baggage on it about
 the date mentioned we suggest
 that either of the three lines men-
 tioned should be utilized & we
 shall be glad to receive C. O.
 authority in this matter.
