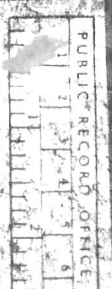

"Medical Officers on first appointment will be required to undergo a course of instruction for about 5 months either at the London School of Tropical Medicine or at the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine. If for any reason a medical officer is prevented from taking such a course on first appointment, he will be required to do so at the first opportunity and he will not be eligible for admission to the permanent and pensionable staff of the Protectorates until he has taken one of these courses".
