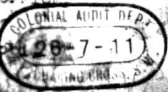

Sir,
I have the honor to receive your permission to
make application for an extra position to be filled immediately
for employment in the Railway Audit Office, two clerks, one
fourth and one fifth class for which provision is made in
the current estimates.

I have the honor to inform the staff in the Railway
Office are now reduced to 1 Assistant Auditor and
2 clerks. The additions in the Audit Staff have been due
to undertaking the annual audit of Protectorate Expenditure
and the Revenue Audit. During that time the Railway
annual receipts had increased from Rs. 5,480,000 to
Rs. 6,700,000, and the annual expenditure from Rs. 2,510,000
to Rs. 2,687,000. The traffic has increased by 33% and the
accounts of Clearing, Provident Fund, and "To Pay" System
have been added.

The special circumstances which call for the
immediate increase of staff and the introduction of the
new form of the Railway monthly account imposed by the
Treasurer's Cash Account, which is now brought into line
with the Colonial Regulations, and the construction of the
Singapore Railway. In connection with the former
the Chief Accountant estimated that 2500 would be required
for increasing his staff and Mr. Power pointed out in a
letter to the Secretary to the Administration (S.N.P. 284/10)
that an extra clerk would be required for auditing if the
new system were introduced.
