In the very near future the traffic for the construction of the Mysore Railway and the beginning of the Deep water port at Mysore will first increase the accounting and the expense of the Auditor to the Audit staff.

Before leaving for England the Auditor instructed me to pay for these two clerks "to be paid until the end of the year" as it was not finally decided upon the amount of the up-keep fund. As it is now been decided a credit of Rs. 1000/- may be granted.



SUBJ:

I have the honor to request you permission to make application for my own selection to be appointed immediately for employment in the Railway Audit Office, two clerks, one fourth and one fifth class for whom no provision is made in the current Estimates.

In view of the fact that we require to increase the staff in the Railway Office we intend shall need an Assistant Auditor and two clerks. All additions in the Audit Staff have been due to understanding the actual audit of Protracted Expenditure and the Railway Audit. During the last time the Railway account received from us for the sum of Rs 2,5,450,000 to Rs 4,12,000, and the annual expenditure from Rs 2,510,000 to Rs 4,12,000. The traffic has increased by 35% and the accounts of Chartered, Provident Fund, and "To Pay" System have been added.

The special circumstances which call for the immediate increase of staff and the introduction of the new form of the Railway Audit account deposited in the Treasurer's Cash Account which is now brought into line with the Colonial Regulations, and the construction of the Inter-Communication Building. In connection with the former it was first apprehended estimated that 2000 would be required for increasing the staff and Mr. Powning pointed out in a letter to the Secretary to the Administration (D.E.P. 2264/10) that an extra clerk would be required for auditing if the new system were introduced.
