It is my pleasure to request your permission to make application for appointment to engage immediately for employment in the Railway Audit Office, two clerks, one fourth and one fifth class, for whom no provision is made in the current Estimates.

In the last five years the staff in the Railway Office has increased from 1 Assistant Auditor and 5 clerks. The additions in the Audit Staff have been due to increasing the total audit of Protectorate Expenditure and the Railway Audit. During that time the Railway annual receipts have increased from Rs. 5,450,000 to Rs. 6,500,000, and the annual expenditure from Rs. 2,510,000 to Rs. 3,000,000. The traffic has increased by 25% and the accounts of Contingency, Provident Fund, and "To Pay" System have been introduced.

The special circumstances which call for the immediate increase of staff are the introduction above all of the Railway Audit account embodied in the Treasurer's Cash Account which is now brought into line with the Colonial Regulations, and the construction of the Inter-colonial Railways. In connection with the former the Chief Accountant estimated that 2300 would be required for increasing his staff, and Mr. Powring pointed out in a letter to the Secretary to the Administration (C.M.P. 224/10) that an extra clerk would be required for auditing if the new system were introduced.

In the very near future the traffic for the construction of the Magadi Railway and the beginning of the Deep water pier at Mombasa will further increase the accounting and the necessity for the addition to the Audit staff.

Before leaving for England the Auditor instructed me to apply for these two clerks but to wait until the new Railway monthly account was definitely decided upon before sending in the application. As it is far now been done I would request that this function may be granted.

The annual salary of the 4th & 5th grade Clerks is Rs. 1000 and Rs. 900 respectively. If the above additional staff is provided the extra will be incurred for the remainder of the current financial year, 8 months from August 1st last, will be Rs. 1100 or £75. It is probable that there will be a saving of £70 on the schedule of the Audit Estimate Travelling, Subsistence Expenses, and Conveniences during the year, but a further vote of about £200 will be required for passages.
