Sir,

I transmit to you herewith a copy of a letter from the Colonial Office requesting that steps may be taken to ascertain whether the German, Italian, Belgian and Soudanese Governments would be willing to co-operate with His Majesty's Government in raising the limit of weight at which elephant tusks may be traded in or exported from Africa to twenty five or thirty pounds

The letter enclosed by the Colonial Office shows that the extermination of the elephant is probable unless measures are taken to prevent it and I request that you will take the necessary steps to carry out Mr. Secretary Harcourt's wishes.
