Sir:-

With reference to your letter 14559 of the 15th instant, I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to transmit to you herewith, for Mr. Secretary Harcourt's information, a paraphrase of a telegram from His Majesty's Ambassador in Rome on the subject of the decision of His Majesty's Government to hand over the said ~~land~~ at the mouth of the Juba River to the Italians.

Sir E. Grey proposes, if Mr. Harcourt concurs, to approve Sir H. Bodd's suggestion to record the arrangement by an exchange of notes, and to add a paragraph safeguarding any proprietary rights of individuals which may be found to exist in the ceded area.

Paraphrase of Telegram from Sir R. Rodd, No. 9, Africa,
dated May 19th, 1911.

Much appreciation is shown here at His Majesty's
Government's decision with regard to the north of the
Juba River, conveyed to me in your telegram of May 17th.

I have been asked by the Minister for Foreign
Affairs whether it may be recorded in an exchange of
notes. If approved, I would propose to add that due
respect will be observed not to be shown to any
proprietary rights of individuals which may be found
to exist in the ceded area.
