Sir,

I have the honour to transmit herewith translation of a Note which I have received from the Italian Government, in reply to the communication which I addressed to them, as instructed in your despatch No 21 Africa of the 1st ultimo, regarding the appointment of a technical Arbitration Commission to decide the level for the irrigation headworks on the Juba River.

In this Note the ^{Marsini} ~~Comite~~ di San Giuliano suggests that the Commission should be composed of a Representative of the British and Italian Governments respectively with a third member co-opted by the two delegates. The Italian Government have as yet made no suggestion regarding the date when the Commission shall ~~meet~~ ^{meet}. I will therefore revert to the point should occasion arise, on learning your views regarding the composition of the Commission.
