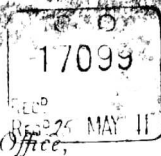

With reference to your letter of the 9th instant, No: 14438/1911, I am commanded by the Army Council to transmit a copy of a statement of the means of support possessed by the widow of Major Colin Campbell Boileau, formerly Indian Army; and to state, for the information of Mr. Secretary Harcourt, that the pension of £70 a year, of which she was formerly in receipt from Army Funds as the widow of Major James Bond Clarke, Scottish Rifles, has been restored to her, with effect from the 27th February 1911, the date following that of the death of Major Boileau.

I am to enquire whether, in these circumstances, Mrs. Boileau should be directed to apply to your Department for a form, on which to make application for a compassionate gratuity from East Africa Protectorate Funds.
