

Referring to your letter of the 24th January I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you for Mr Secretary Harcourt's information that they have no objection to the suggestions contained in the letter from the Acting Governor of British East Africa, dated 13th December 1910, that Officers of the Special Reserve and Territorial Force, residing in the Protectorate for any length of time, should be attached to the King's African Rifles for one month annually in lieu of their annual training, and should receive Army rates of pay which would be defrayed from Army Funds.
