TREASURY CHAMBERS.

27th January 1911

Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 18th instant (39932/1910), on the subject of the Medical Staff in the East Africa Protectorate.

Mr. Secretary Harcourt invites a reference to the letter from your department of the 3rd instant (38934/1910), regarding the medical staff in Nyasaland, and I am to state in answer that, in Their Lordships' opinion, the considerations urged in Their reply of the 17th instant to that letter apply with equal weight to the present proposal to make permanent the temporary medical posts in the East Africa Protectorate.

For the reasons then stated Their Lordships feel very reluctant to make permanent appointments which at present are specifically made to combat the sleeping sickness, and if the matter is to be further considered it appears to Them necessary to be informed of the exact number of officers, temporary and permanent, who are exclusively or principally engaged upon this service at the present moment. They very much hope however that Mr. Harcourt will be able in one or other of the ways suggested in the concluding paragraph of Their letter already cited to obviate the present difficulty and in that event
