The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having had before Them Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 27th instant (829/1911) and the enclosures relative to the grant of subsistence and other allowances to Sir P.Girouard and to the officers who have been working with him during his visit to this country on duty, direct me to state that They assent to the various proposals put forward by Mr. Secretary Harcourt with respect to Captain O'Brien, Mr. Hoey and Mr. Powter.

With regard, however, to the case of Sir Percy Gircuard I am to point out that his salary of £3,000 per annum must be regarded as including an allowance for expenditure on entertainment and the maintenance of his establishment, on which there must be a considerable saving during his absence from his post. Unless therefore it can be stated that Sir P. Gircuard has incurred additional expenditure in consequence of his stay in this country, over and above what ne would have had to incur if he had remained at his post, My Lords see no reason for making any special allowance to him.
