I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Tox's letter of the 4th ultimo (36691/1910) and the enclosed copy of a despatch from the Jovernor of the East Africa Protectorate recommending that Mr.A.F.Townsend, Deputy Mirector, Cadastral Branch of Surveys, and Mr.A.Fehm, Superintending Clerk, Accountant and Storekeeper, Survey Department, should be granted pensionable status.

In reply I am to say that it would appear from Mr. Secretary Marcourt's observations that a clear distinction in respect of permanence can be drawn between the Cadestral and other branches of the Curvey Department in this Protectorate and that the former branch can be similarly differentiated from the various sections of the Survey Department in Uganda. On this understanding My Lords are willing to authorise the assignment of pension rights to the two posts, specified above provided that a deduction of ten per cent is made from the salary attached to each.
