

TREASURY CHAMBERS,

Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Cox's letter of the 4th ultimo (36691/1910) and the enclosed copy of a despatch from the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate recommending that Mr. A. E. Townsend, Deputy Director, Cadastral Branch of Surveys, and Mr. A. Penn, Superintending Clerk, Accountant and Storekeeper, Survey Department, should be granted pensionable status.

In reply I am to say that it would appear from Mr. Secretary Harcourt's observations that a clear distinction in respect of permanence can be drawn between the Cadastral and other branches of the Survey Department in this Protectorate and that the former branch can be similarly differentiated from the various sections of the Survey Department in Uganda. On this understanding My Lords are willing to authorise the assignment of pension rights to the two posts specified above provided that a deduction of ten per cent is made from the salary attached to each.

My Lords further agree that the temporary service of the two officers named may be allowed to reckon for purposes of pension, in the case of Mr. Townsend as from the date of his first appointment as a Surveyor in the East
