Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 25th ultimo (284/1911) enclosing a copy of a letter from Sir P. Girouard on the subject of the redemption of slaves held by Somalis in the East Africa Protectorate.

My Lords learn that, while it was at one time thought that an expenditure of £30,000 on compensation for slaves would suffice, it is now anticipated that the full amount of £40,000 provided will be required. In these circumstances They concur in Mr. Secretary Harcourt's proposal that, of the balance available, a sum of £500 should be allotted for the redemption of Somali slaves.
