I am directed by Mr. Secretary Harcourt to inform you that he has under contemplation the question of abolishing on the ground of economy, the Bombay Agency and of employing a commercial firm

to perform the commercial work hitherto

performed by the Agency.

It is not proposed to proceed with the abolition of the Agency immediately as time will be required for the Prefectorate Governmente to make the necessary arrangements with a commerci firm, and enquiries will also have to be

made of the Toward of India ag to

0

tectorate Governments for the payment of the colores of those Governments on leave in India, and for the raising and despatch of the Indian Contingents for Somaliland, Uganda, and Nyasaland. But, subject to a satisfactory settlement of these questions, "r. Harcourt has decided that the Agency shall be abolished at the end of the financial year 1911-12.

3. Mr. Harcourt much regrets that this decision will render it necessary for him to call upon you to retire, with such retiring allowance as you may have earned, at the end of next financial year or at such time as he may finally decide that the agency shall be abolished.
