Zaphiro who is at present employed as District Commissioner in the East Africa Protectorate should be transferred to the service of His Majesty's Lagation in the capacity of Interpreter and he suggests alterations in the Legation Staff of interpreture the net result of which (combined with the appointment of Mr. Machino) would be to raise the cost of the establishment from £373 to £570 per annum.
