Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Cox's letter of the 12th ultimo (10701/1911), further respecting the salaries to be assigned to the posts of Chief Secretary and Treasurer in the Bast Africa Protectorate.

In reply I am to disclaim on behalf of Their Lordships any intention to interfere with the action of the Secretary of State in purely administrative matters, but I am to say that They cannot concur in the view, implied in the letter under reply, that the questions now under discussion fall within this category. In their opinion increases of salary involve considerations of a special character. In the first place the expenditure which they entail is recurrent, while the economiesor the growth of revenue by which at the moment they are justified may prove to be only temporary or casual. They tend moreover to raise the standard of personal remmeration not only throughout the Colony or Protectorate sescerned but in other administrations as well, and it is a dommon experience of Their Lordships to be asked to increase the pay of a pest in one Protectorate on the ground of the salary assigned to a similar post in another

thite therefore by Lords readily shift the evident regard to company visitation as a general rule Mr. Harcourt's various proposable are prepared and the consequent improvement in the finances of those Protectorates at any

rate in which Their Lordships are interested. They cannot agree to divest themselves, as apparently Mr. Harcourt desires, of the right to criticise proposals which either increase the remuneration of existing posts or diminish their duties or responsibilities without a corresponding reduction in salary.

In Their Lordahips' opinion Mr. Harcourt's present recommendations are open to objection on both these grounds. Nor are They prepared to admit that the salaries paid in self-supporting Colonies can be generally taken as a proper measure of the remaneration to be granted in a Protectorate dependent upon the Imperial Exchequer.

Having regard, however, to the distinction which Mr. Harcourt has drawn in the letter under reply between the duties of the Chief Secretary in the East Africa Protectorate and those of similar posts in Uganda and Northern Nigeria and in view of the importance which he attaches to his proposal, My Lords are willing to agree to the salary which he recommends for Mr.Bowring.

But the considerations which have led Their Lordships to make this concession appear to Them to tell in favour of a greater reduction of the Treasurer's emoluments. It is unnecessary to remind Mr. Harcourt that Mr. Bowring's salary was increased in connection with the estimates for the current year mainly on the ground that he was at that time discharging many of the duties of Chief secretary also. The importance of those duties no doubt warranted the increase but was that they have been transferred from the post of Treasurer My Lords consider that a corresponding reduction of salary might be looked for. In these circumstances They consider that there would have been some ground for a line that the salary of the pest should be reduced below that

remuneration for the diminished duties should not exceed that sesigned to the pest during Mr. Bowring's tenure of it. In these circumstances My Lords regret that They are unable to modify the view expressed in Their previous letter with regard to the remuneration to be assigned in future to the post of Treasurer and They hope that on reconsideration Mr. Hardourt will see his way to modify his proposals in this respect.
