I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes's letter of the 9th instant (12352/1911) and its accompanying copy of a despatch from the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate on the subject of the new Leave and Passage Regulations.

In reply I am to state that in the circumstances represented by Mr. Secretary Harcourt My Lords are willing that so long as the agreement with the Union Castle Steamship Company continues unaltered the Regulations in question should be so amended as to provide that, if an officer has to travel by a steamer sailing before his leave has expired, he may add the unexpired portion of his leave to his next period of leave.
