Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 28th ultimo (13010/1911) respecting the pensionable salary of Mr. Espie, Deputy Treasurer in the East Africa Protectorate.

In reply I am to state that My Lords regret that They see no sufficient reason for the proposed immediate increase of total emoluments, but in order to obviate the possibility of hardship in the event suggested, They would be prepared as a special case to count so much of Mr. Espie's duty allowance for pension as would not raise his total pensionable emoluments above £550, and They trust that Mr. Harcourt will be satisfied with this solution of the difficulty.
