I am directed by the Earl of Crewe to inform you that, subject to your being passed as medically fit for service, he proposes to select you for temporary employment as Medical Officer in the East Africa Protectorate with salary at the rate of £200 per annum, quarters free of rent, but not of rates of similar outgoings, would be provided, or an allowance in lieu.

2. Your appointment would be for 3 years from the date of your arrival at Mombasa. The first class passages would be provided, and you would receive half salary from the

You would, like the permanent Medical Officers, be under the orders of the Governor and the superior officers of the Medical Department. The duties of the appointment would be those ordinarily performed by a ^{senior} Medical Officer, and you would understand that you may be called upon for service in connection with the measures which are being taken to prevent the spread of sleeping sickness among the natives of the country. A memorandum showing the general conditions attached to appointments in the East Africa Protectorate is enclosed, and you will of course be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced or which the Secretary of State. A copy of the previous regulations is also enclosed, but these regulations will apply to you

only

only if you are subsequently placed on the permanent and pensionable staff of the Protectorate.

4. If you are prepared to accept this offer, you should present yourself, without delay, for examination to one of the Medical Advisers whose names are given on the enclosed letter. The letter should be sent with the Medical Adviser who will send his report direct to this Department. You will be required to pay him his professional fee of one guinea.

5. It is customary to require Medical Officers to attend a course of instruction either at the London or the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine prior to their departure from this country. As, however, it would be impossible for you to take up your appointment until January next if you were to wait for the next course of instruction, Lord Cromer is willing to allow you to defer the course

until

until your first leave of absence. In this connection I would like to draw your attention to Section 2 of the Regulations for the employment of officers appointed to the East Africa, Uganda and Southern Protectorates.

As you will be aware, it is as soon as possible whether you are prepared to accept this offer and if so, whether you would be prepared to leave England for the Union of South Africa which is due to start from Southampton on the 3rd of November and to arrive at Johannesburg on the 5th of December. It is very desirable that you should take up your duties as soon as can be arranged, and I would like to state that you will be able to travel by the steamer named.

In the event of your accepting this offer, you should furnish me with an address to which communications intended for your relatives or friends can be sent in your absence.
