WHITEHALL, LONDON, S. W.

Sir,

The Seventh-day Adventist denomination has been carrying on missionary work, by means of industrial schools, among the Kavironda people of British East Africa for the past seven years. At present we have in the field a force of eight English workers, including wives; and our membership in England bears, to a large extent, the financial responsibility of the Mission.

We are desirous of enlarging our sphere of operations in the Protectorate and are prepared to send out additional workers from England as soon as one or more suitable sites for stations can be secured.

May we ask for the privilege of an interview with the gentleman in whose province it would fall to deal with the matter, for the purpose of laying before him any desired information and submitting an application for a suitable grant of land. Mr. L. R. Conradi, who is personally acquainted with our Kavironda Mission, and who will shortly be re-visiting it, is to be in London next week, and we would feel greatly obliged if an interview could be granted Mr. Conradi and the writer at any hour on the 29th, 30th, or 31st of this month.
