Sir,
I regret that owing to my absence from Shottermill your enquiry of the 1st inst., No. 38006/1911 has not yet received an answer.

In reply I have to state :-

1. That our terms for pupilage extending over a period of approximately 6 months would be 50 guineas, the pupil paying his own board and lodging. Lodgings could be obtained in the neighbourhood of any of our Fisheries, at which the pupil might wish to acquire experience, for reasonable terms.

In this connection I have to point out that we carry on rather different classes of work at our different Fisheries and in order to obtain a comprehensive knowledge of the work it would be advisable for the pupil to spend not only some time at Shottermill but also at Nainsworth, and possibly also at the Solway Fishery, Dumfries.

In reply to your third paragraph we should request a pupil to sign an undertaking that he would not use the information acquired in competition with us in this country either directly or by communicating information to our competitors say for a time of 5 years. In this connection I have to point out that I understand that the instruction desired is not quite that which is necessary to a ^{commercial} trout-grower but rather resembles the kind of knowledge required by the State Fish-culturists of America and the Colonies. Their work differs in important points from strictly commercial work, and a good many questions of the highest importance to the commercial fish-culturist are not comprised in it.

At the conclusion of the course the pupil, should be competent to undertake the care of breeding trout, to spawn, incubate, collect and despatch ova under varying conditions of temperature and climate, superintend the construction of hatcheries, and rearing ponds, have some knowledge of the principal maladies to which Trout are subject and of the conditions necessary to their well-being, and of the various

danger that have to be provided against in their cultivation. He should also be competent to handle Trout and to prepare and despatch them for travelling.

In addition he should have learnt to rear Trout to the yearling stage with a fair amount of success, though a finished knowledge of this branch, which is the most difficult part of fish-culture, could not be acquired in the short time of 6 months.

I presume that a pupil would wish to fit himself by actual practical work for the different operations carried on and while we should of course not look to utilise his work as a means of profit to ourselves he would in carrying out work of the kind place himself for the time being under the authority of either of our local managers.

I may say that our different fisheries respectively carry on the following work :-

- The Surrey Trout Farm, Shottermill. Production of breeding fish and two-year-old Trout.
- The Midland Fishery, Nailsworth:- Rearing of Yearling and two-year-old Trout, and trout for eating purposes.
