Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 20005/44 of the 16th inst. relating to the apparently so far unopened by the Crown Agent in Stanley candidate to file his nomination for Sergeant Police Constable in the Port Moresby Protection.

2. I am somewhat loath to recommend any change in the conditions of service under which Sergeant Constable holds the Post. After Police service in our Country like Port Moresby will not in my opinion improve the European population and the European Police but do you think a body - it is quite outside the bounds of possibility that even - might arise when it would be necessary to employ European Constables, or from importunate public safety applications to the force and before turning to a police force of this nature. In such a contingency any further a illegal whom might possibly interfere with the process of removal. In fact however, had candidate passed some years the type of police work looks pretty to leave him well there at a reasonable age he might be passing from protection to permanent Police

3. Based on the reasoning as appears to me now, I have decided to follow the suggestion put forward in para 2 of the despatch, now under my control with all possible means of obtaining recruits from present stations for the police institution placing a very important part in the administration of the Protection. I would continue to suggest therefore that the Crown Agent, in writing to the methods now being employed by the authorities to recruit, a measure which I think I am right in saying they have not as yet employed. In my case I hope that
