PIER AND ELEVATOR AT W. LINDINI

Probably Mr. Kinchin wishes to make some proposal for the construction of an elevator in the event of the Government undertaking the pier. It seems hardly necessary or desirable that Mr. Harcourt should be troubled personally in the matter. I presume that you would be willing to see Mr. Kinchin if he called.

Tell him that a member of the East African department will be glad to see him if he will indicate when he proposes to call.

I attach an extract from the Treasury letter (17589) relating to the loan out of which the deep water pier is to be constructed. When we have heard what Mr. Kinchin has to say, we must ask the Governor for a detailed estimate of the cost of construction, of the working expenses, and of the revenue of the pier, with a view to obtaining

Sir P. Girouard will know from the correspondence which has already been sent to him that Mr. Kinchin's round estimate of £100,000 for the pier does not give us anything like enough to go upon in arranging for the actual undertaking of the work. He should be asked at the same time to give careful consideration to the Treasury suggestion that it would be unwise to fix the landing charges for the use of the pier so low in the first instance as was suggested in paragraph 4 of his letter of the 50th of January.

(1) My Lords would be glad to receive a detailed estimate as revised by the Consulting Engineers of the cost of construction, working expenses (including depreciation and repairs), and revenue, of the Egg Water Pier at Kilindini.

They would also suggest for the consideration of Mr Harcourt whether, pending experience of the financial success of that undertaking, it would not be inadvisable to fix the landing charges so low as from one half to one third of the lighterage charges now ruling, as proposed. Apparently the latter charges at present vary from Rs.3 to Rs.5 per ton, and their Lordships suggest that a smaller reduction should be tried, at any rate in the first instance.
