With reference to your letter of the 27th of April 1908, No. 13496/1908, and to the reply from this Office of the 4th of May 1908, No. 317876-07, concerning the insurance of letters and parcels by the Post Office of British East Africa, I am directed by the Postmaster General to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, according to a letter recently received from the Post Office of British East Africa and Uganda, that Office is now prepared to undertake insurance of letters and to extend the system of insurance for parcels.

Arrangements have been made for the extension of the system as regards parcels; and Mr. Samuel proposes, if the Secretary of State sees no objection, to take steps for the formal notification of the intention of the Colonial Post Office as regards the insurance of letters to be given to the Swiss Government. It is understood that, if the system is established, it will apply to Mombasa, Lamu, Nairobi, Nakuru and Kisumu only in East Africa and to Entebbe, Kampala, and Jinja only in Uganda.
