Sir,

1. With reference to my interview with Mr. Batterbee at the Colonial Office yesterday, I have the honour to report as follows:
2. The Government of the East Africa Protectorate, in consultation with the Honorable the Director of Agriculture decided to take part in the International Rubber Exhibition to be opened at the Agricultural Hall, Islington, on the 26th instant.
3. The official file of papers dealing with the Rubber Exhibition was seen by me on more than one occasion in East Africa, and I am in a position to state that a space of ten feet by ten feet was applied for by the Government to Mr. Staines Manders, Manager of the Exhibition.
4. Correspondence was also had with Messrs Piggott Brothers Limited 32, Bishopsgate Street with respect to providing a suitable stand for the Protectorate's Rubber Exhibit, but it was arranged that the selection of the pattern of the stand should be

left to me.

On the 2nd instant, I called on Messrs Piggott Brothers and the same day visited the Agricultural Hall, and arranged with their representative as to the form the stand should take. A sketch of the stand has been submitted to me and I consider it very suitable for the purpose intended, and the cost - £16.10.0 is reasonable. I submit herewith a letter from Messrs Piggott Brothers on the subject of the stand.

I also called on Mr. Staines Manders, on the 2nd instant, and discussed with him general matters affecting the exhibit of Rubber from the East Africa Protectorate, and corrected the final proof of an article on the Country for inclusion in the Official Guide Book to the Rubber Exhibition.

Before leaving East Africa for Italy, I arranged on behalf of the Honorable the Director of Agriculture, for the getting together of the samples of rubber and the despatch of same to the Imperial Institute London, to await my arrival in England, and I was requested to make all the necessary preparations for and to instal the Protectorate's Exhibit, have charge of same during the Exhibition and the disposal of the Rubber afterwards.

There is ample time for dealing with all matters regarding the East Africa Exhibit, but as I am desirous of visiting my family in Somerset, I should be obliged if you would authorise Messrs Piggott Brothers to proceed with the erection of the stand,


at the Agricultural Hall, as per sketch supplied me, and which I am personally returning to them.

9. I would also ask to be allowed to say that Mr. Staines Wanders is desirous of receiving payment for the space reserved for the East Africa Protectorate. Mr. Staines Wanders has very generously placed a space of ten feet by fifteen feet at my disposal for the same charge as made for the ten feet by ten feet applied for. The extra space will be utilised in displaying a set of photographs, now being enlarged by Mr. Andrew Baird, Edinburgh, as well as a collection of beans and oil seeds used as catch-crops between the rows of young rubber trees, and probably samples of fibre indigenous and exotic to British East Africa.

10. It is my intention to again call on Mr. Batterbee tomorrow (9th instant) and I shall take care to be in London again towards the end of next week.

Re your esteemed enquiry, we have pleasure in submitting rough sketch for the treatment of your space at the forthcoming Rubber Exhibition at the Agricultural Hall, comprising 10' partitions at sides and back, finished with cornice moulding, white frieze, and picture rail and counter running round the three sides, shaped as shown with corner pyramid, shelves at back and front hung with fireproofed green material; one way fascia 10' x 3' lettered in green and shaded with gold, supported by moulded panels 2' 9" wide and 9' high with space for photos, floor covered with lino, and one round pyramid pedestal 3' high with 2" - 6" risers, about 2' 6" diameter.

Our price for the hire, for the period of the Exhibition, erection and removal, including a muslin roof would be £16. 10. 0.
