affidavits & oaths - brief note

British Govt. make no law or do
any thing to prevent the making of
affidavits & oaths in form and
then the Govt. can't do it.

Part 66

Section 66 of the Act of 1865

Section 66 of the Act of 1865 says now
the other Courts ~~are~~ ^{can} make affidavits and
in the presence of the High Court and
the other Courts ~~are~~ ^{can} make affidavits and
orders do not apply to affidavits.

British jurisdiction

In British Courts as concerned, the proviso of section
with Order XXVII of the Act of 1865 provides that
no affidavit may be made "in any place not
situated in any Province here or authority to
make such an affidavit at that place and according
to the law of that place". The present practice of the
High Court is to require, in the case of an affidavit
seen by a foreign court who has authority
to admit the same, a copy of the law of that place
by the High Court or by the Court of Justice.

[This is not an absolute condition of the affidavit]
