With reference to your despatch No. 290 of the 31st May 1911, I have the honour to inform you that after due consideration I am prepared to withdraw the recommendations made in my despatch No. 470 of the 5th August 1910 respecting the discontinuance of the grant of free passages to the locally engaged Asiatic Clerks.

2. I feel that some hardship is entailed in refusing the privilege of a free passage especially since the local firms make a practice of allowing their Asiatic employees liberal terms as regards leave, and I do not wish to make it increasingly difficult for Government to enlist good men on this account.

3. I propose, therefore, subject to your concurrence, to allow all locally engaged Asiatic Clerks the same leave advantages as other members of the Non-European Clerical Staff but before making any public notification I will
