I have the honour to confirm my telegram No. 15 of the 16th instant on the subject of providing funds for the erection of a Post Office at Kombasa.

1. Provision has been made in the draft estimates for the past two years but the item has had to be deleted owing to lack of funds under the half and half principle.

2. The need however for a new Post Office at Kombasa has now become urgent as it is practically impossible to deal efficiently and expeditiously with the work in the present buildings.

3. As mentioned in my telegram a sum of £7,500 for purchase of revenue stores was wrongly included in the draft estimates for 1912-13 under the Railway Schedules of Revenue and Expenditure. The removal of this amount will make no difference in the resulting net revenue of the Railway but will leave a sum of £3,750 available for further expenditure.

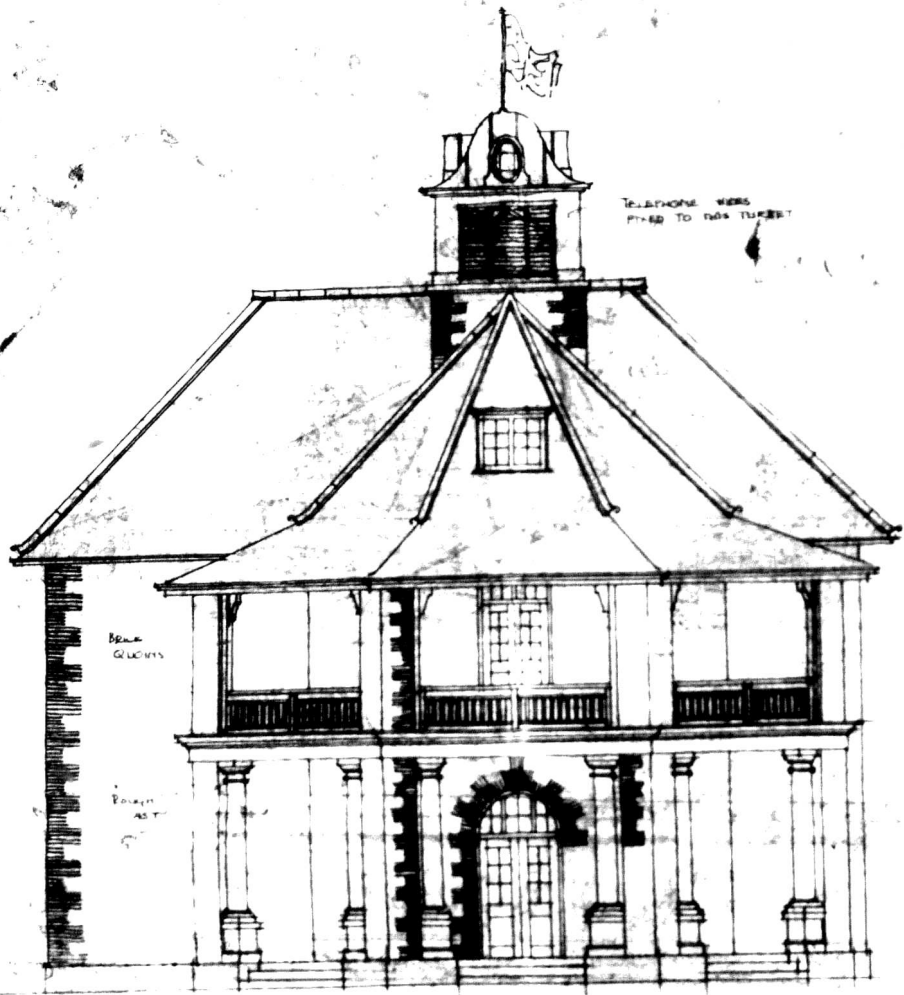

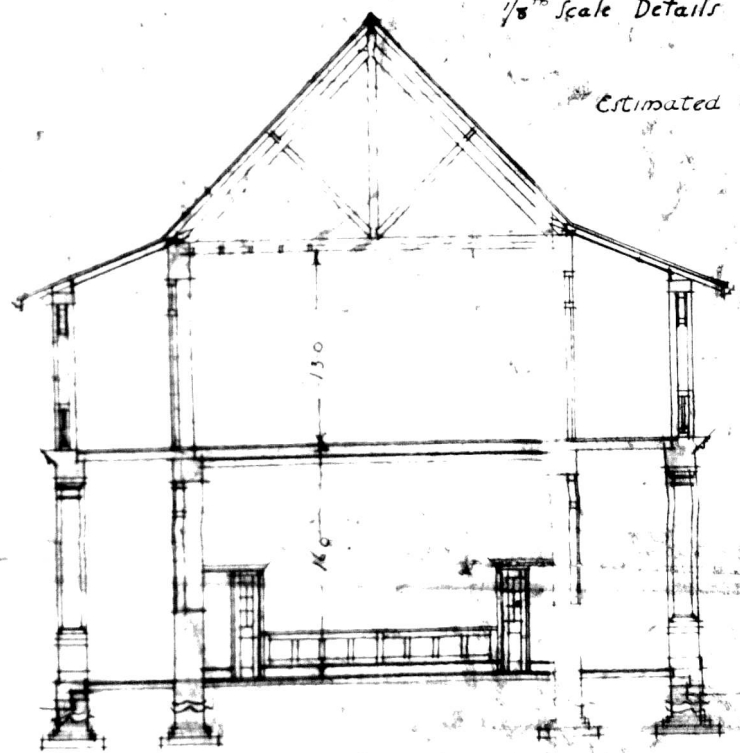

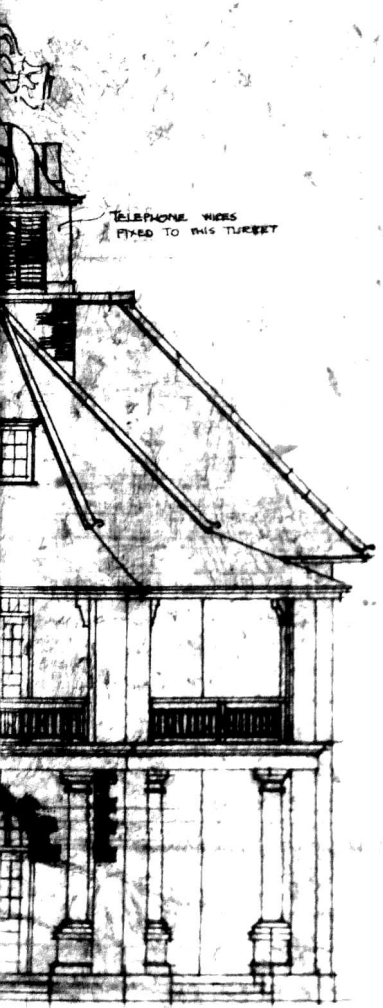
PROPOSED NEW POST OFFICE

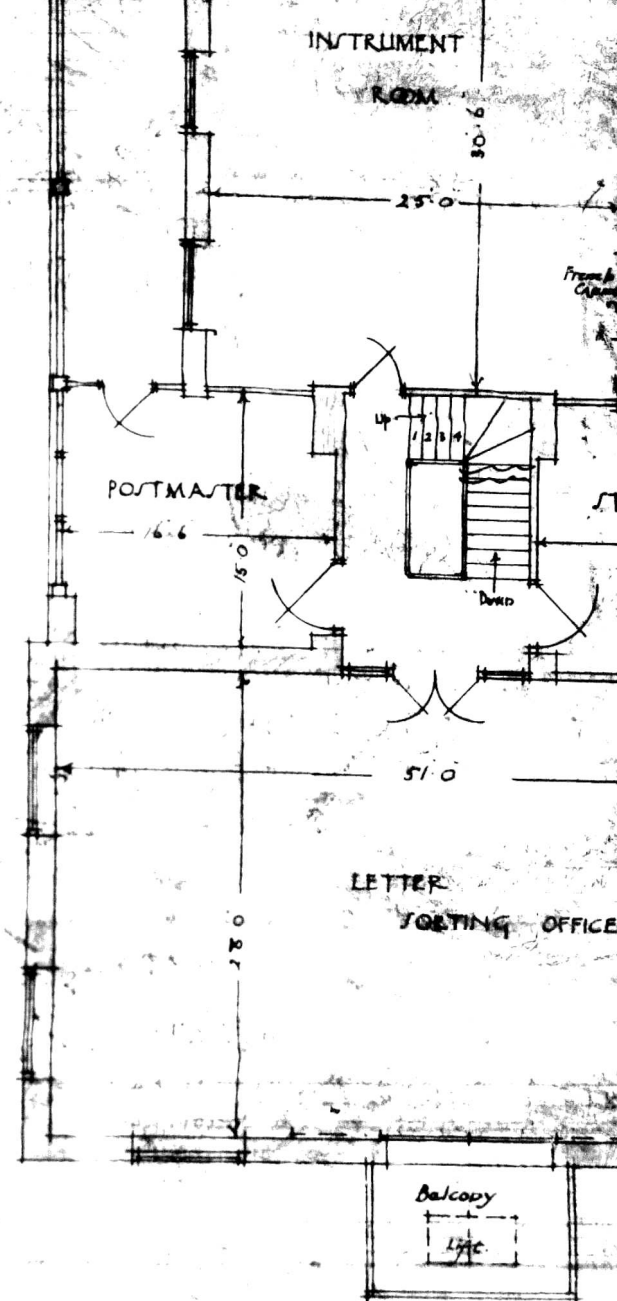
BLOCK PLAN

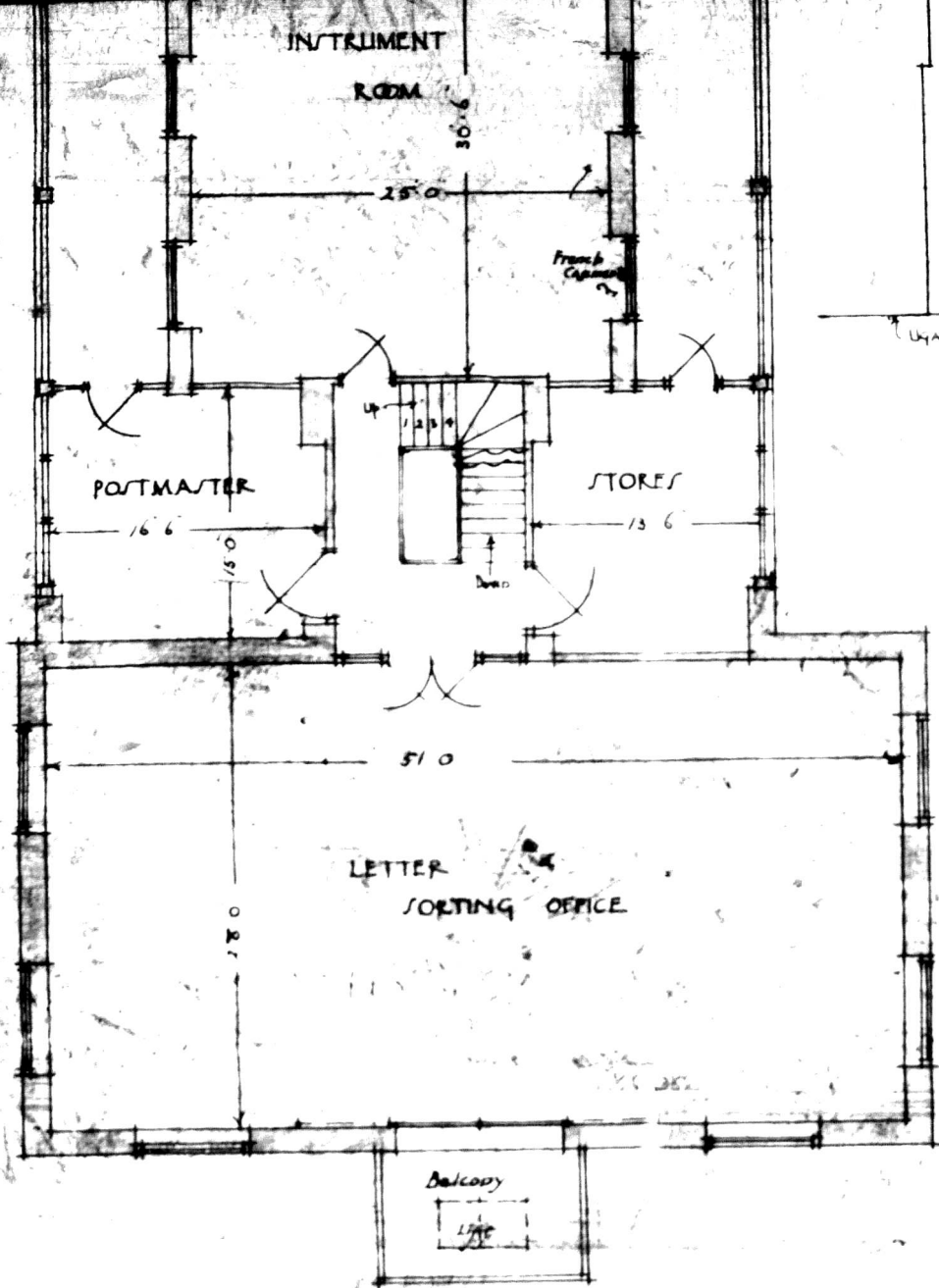




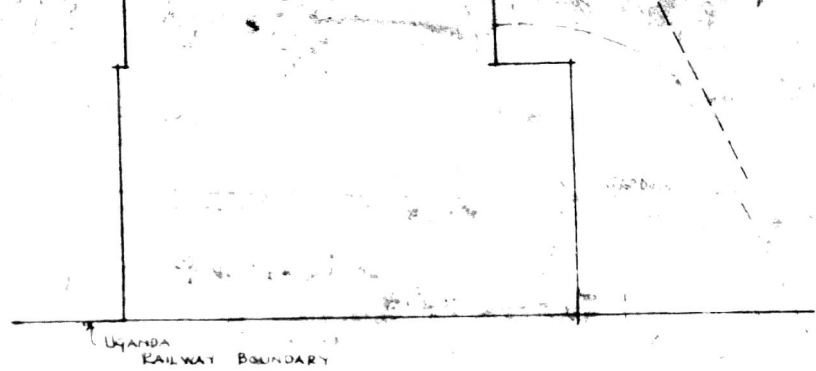
GROUND FLOOR PLAN



FIRST FLOOR PLAN

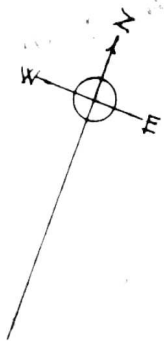


FIRST FLOOR PLAN
