Sir,

I have the honor to address you on the subject of the proposed bill in my name, caused by the resignation of Mr. Heriton, Storekeeper and Chief Clerk in the Telegraph Department, referred to in my despatch No. 68 of 20-10-11.

2. As the result of the amalgamation of the Postal and Telegraph Departments, the Postmaster General's office which has to post lately held by Mr. Heriton has consequently been abolished, since it is now the duty of the Superintendent of the Post Office to take charge of the existing Correspondence Section of the Postal Department, and the necessary arrangements to combine the two departments.

3. As however, the business of the Postal Department, Mr. Heriton undertakes some notable amount of correspondence, and the work is rapidly increasing in importance and quantity, I consider that the post should not be made a purely engineering one. I therefore have the honor to ask that an Advertising Officer be recruited.
