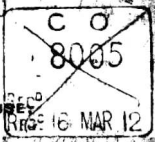

I have the honour to refer to Mr. Monson's despatch No. 16 of January 7th 1911<sup>x</sup> respecting certain land held by Mrs. Long, the wife of an official in the Postal Department, and to report that though repeatedly requested to divest herself of this property she continues to evade my instructions and to reply that she is waiting to get her price.

2. The value of land in Nairobi has increased considerably during the last year and there is no doubt that Mrs. Long could realise a handsome profit on her original outlay. I would therefore ask authority to dismiss Mr. Long from the Postal Department if at the date of your reply the property in question is still in his wife's hands.
