With reference to your Confidential despatch of the 4th ultime, I have the honour to inform you that I have sanctioned the formation of the Legion of Frontiersmen Unit under Ordinance No.7 of 1911 and that there are 98 members of the corps desirous of joining the...

the Legion of Frontiersmen by the Army Council
I would venture to observe that in so far at
this Protectorate is concerned the members of
the corps are taking the oath of allegiance
under the Volunteer Ordinance in exactly the
same manner as members of other units and they
are liable to every provision of the Ordinance.

If the reserve is called out the Governor has
power to appoint a Commander of the whole but
