MEMORANDUM.

THE HATLYE HUT AND FULL TAX AMENDMENT OFFINANCE, 1912.

1. The Native But and Poll Tax Amendment Ordinance 1911 purported to repeal Section 7 of the Native But and Poll Tax Amendment Ordinance 1910 and prescribed another procedure for the recovery of the tax from a person in default.

The Secretary of State expressed imself unable to approve of the Amending Ordinance.

- 2. This Ordinance repeals the 1911 Ordinance and reinstates Section 7 in the Ordinance of 1910, and further confers upon a Magistrate before whom proceedings are taken under that Section the right to make the person in default pay Court Costs not exceeding 3 rupees. The Court Costs are recoverable in the like manner as the tax unpaid.
 - 3. The Ordinance can be assented to by His Excellency forthwith.
