In reply to your despatch No. 668 dated November last, I have the honour to recommend that Miss Stoddard, the Matron, and Mrs E.R. Brown, the Senior Nurse, serving in the Protectorate, should be admitted to the pensionable service.

2. I do not wish to make any recommendation at present in regard to the pensionable appointment of Nurse, as the members of the Staff are all in their first year of service.

3. I would wish however to bring to your notice the case of Miss [redacted] who has just terminated her appointment. She had served for ten years in Cyprus, Nyasaland, the Gold Coast and here, and it seems rather hard that she should so sharply suffer in the benefits of the new proposal.
