My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch

No. 304 of May 30th and previous correspondence respecting
Regulations for the Subordinate Staff of the Protectorate,

I have the honour to report that the Treasurer and the
Manager of the Railway after carefully considering the
question are of opinion that it is impracticable to frame

A set of rules which would be suitable both to Railway
employees and to clerks in the other Departments of
the Service.

The conditions under which Railway servants are
engaged differ considerably from those obtaining else-
where, and I fear that it would not be possible to
achieve the uniformity suggested in Your Lordship's

despatch under reply.
