My Lord,

It has recently been brought to my notice by the Inspector General of Police that in cases of sudden death where the cause of death is suspected, the services of an analyst are very often required, and further that in instances of this kind, in the absence of an analyst, the police are often placed at a serious disadvantage.

The Medical Department has no one at present capable of analysing human remains and I have therefore the honour to submit for Your Lordship's favourable consideration that provision should be made in the ensuing session for the appointment of a Government Analyst.
