My Lord,

In reply to Your Lordship's despatch Confidential of October 31st I have the honour to report that the Nandi prisoners referred to were interned at Mombasa under the "Removal of Natives into Special Districts Ordinance" mentioned in paragraph 8 of Your Lordship's despatch.

I regret that it was erroneously reported in my despatch No. 566 that this action was taken under the provisions of the Order-in-Council.

2. With reference to paragraph 8 of Your Lordship's despatch under reply, instructions have been issued and half yearly reports will be submitted as to the reasons necessitating the detention of the prisoners.

3. The Jubaland prisoners referred to in paragraph 8
