I beg to draw your attention to the advisability of this Protectorate being represented in South Africa for the purpose of supplying the public with information (which at present is unobtainable in South Africa) in order to further the general good and prosperity of this Protectorate by the influx of capital and population.

On behalf of the East Africa Development Company Limited, I am willing to undertake the Agency of this Protectorate, at our head office Permanent Buildings, Johannesburg, without fees or expense.

The Government Gazette and Official reports could be filed in the Consular Offices for the convenience of the public.

I am prepared to advise the public through the South African press of the establishment of the agency in Johannesburg.

It also consider the agency of the Uganda Railway would lead to further the interests of this country by being in a position to supply full information in reference to fares, freight charges, time tables and other information relating to the Railway.

I beg to inform you that I have made a suggestion to the Austrian Lloyd Steam Ship Company to arrange and advertise excursion trips from South Africa to Mombasa and Lake Victoria at reduced fares by their steamers and by arrangement over

the South African Railways, and by altering the date of arrival of steamers from the South by one day earlier and date of departure, from here, of the outward steamers to the South by one day later, would allow sufficient time for visitors to reach the Lake and return to South Africa in 25 days.
