Sir,

With reference to our letter of the 4th instant and previous correspondence, I have the honour to enclose herewith a copy of a further list of candidates for appointment in the Nairobi Police, which we have received from the Commissioner of the London Metropolitan Police.

2. We have now sent you the names of twenty two volunteers from the Liverpool and Manchester, and the London Metropolitan Police forces and presume that as only thirteen constables are required for service in East Africa it will not be necessary for us to obtain any further candidates.

3. I also enclose copies of a memorandum which we addressed to the Chief Constable of Manchester and the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police respecting the medical examination of the candidates from their respective forces, and of the replies we have received.
