I have discussed the question of my allowance and Cape Graham. He agrees with me that the extra allowance of £24 per month makes for a better life. Extra voluntary pay would be preferable. The rates would be £12 - £14, and Rante - £132. This figure is now to be for a Sgt., but the latter might be reduced, I think, to £120; roughly 6/- per diem. Cape Graham considers that actual living expenses might be £25 a month but I don't think this would be the minimum in practice. I am to be paid 5/- per off day of service accordingly.

With reference to our letter of the 4th instant
and previous correspondence, I have the honour to enclose
herewith a copy of a further list of candidates for
appointment in the Nairobi Police, which we have
received from the Commissioner of the London Metropolitan
Police.

2. We have now sent you the names of twenty two
volunteers from the Liverpool and Manchester, and the
London Metropolitan Police forces and presume that as
